-What does quality over quantity mean?

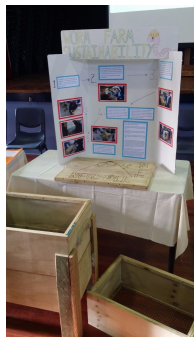
We will be talking about this in class, discussions at home would be really worthwhile as well.

Inglewood Community of Learning update - On Monday I had the privilege to travel to Hamilton with Principal's from our Inglewood Community of Learning (ICoL). We met with lead Principal's from two separate Waikato Communities of Learning and had the opportunity to question them on their experiences so far. This was a great chance for us to learn from their mistakes as well as their successes.

On Tuesday, our local ICoL principals and Board of Trustees representatives met to update our own plans and prepare for the next stages in our own ICoL development. Next term I will include a series of updates in the newsletters to outline our journey and most importantly, how our work together will benefit our children in their entire education journey, from Early Childhood through to the end of High School and beyond. It's very exciting times for our learning community!



Year 7/8 Technology Showcase - Today Inglewood High School hosted a Year 7/8 Technology showcase to share our learning with whanau. This year the technology programme has been updated to include more design and refine to highlight the technological process. The overall theme for the year is 'Sustainable Inglewood'.

For the first two terms our students have been working collaboratively to not only learn to use the machines and equipment in the Hard Materials area, but to analyse and change their designs throughout the process based on

reflections along the way.

We have two fantastic worm farms to add to our sustainable gardens at school as well as the plant stakes/markers and peat pots that they have been creating to take home.



Year 5/6 Interschool Sports - Our third inter school Sports Fixture will be held at Norfolk tomorrow against Mangorei School. Games will start at 12:30pm. If the weather is not suitable we will post on the school facebook and through our school app by 8:30am.

Hot Lunches- These will now be available every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday for winter months. Each Whanau House has been allocated a day when they can bring hot lunches. 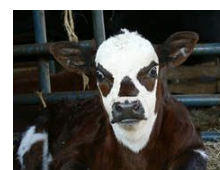
