By now you will be aware that New Zealand primary school teachers and principals will be taking strike action on Wednesday August 15th. **It has now been confirmed this strike will be for the full day.**

We understand that this action will cause inconvenience to families, for which we apologise. We feel very strongly however, that our education system is facing a serious shortage of teachers which is caused by uncompetitive salary and workload issues. We ask that our community support us in this action, which we truly believe is in the best interests of future generations of our children.

As notified in the letter we sent home last Friday afternoon, Norfolk School will be closed on Wednesday August 15th.
