**Show Day procedures for tomorrow** - Some important information for Parents and Children:

We are super excited about Show Day tomorrow. Children and staff have put in a huge amount of work to prepare and despite not having calves this year, we are looking forward to a fantastic day with some new attractions as well.

**Classroom access on the day** - Show Day is an entirely outside learning experience for the whole day. Because of this, the school buildings will be locked for most of the day, including before school. Children are encouraged to keep their school bags with them for the day so that they have everything they need. The senior toilets will be open to access at the rear of the main building. Following the Auctions and raffle draws, we will open the classrooms so that families can view the Mix-up Day creations.

**Evening Viewing** - The school will also be open for families to view all indoor exhibits from 7pm till 8.30pm on Thursday evening.

**Indoor exhibits** - These will be available for the public to view all day in the new covered area in front of the junior school. Parents and whanau can feel free to browse the displays at any time that suits.

**Senior School Market Day Stalls** - Following the raffle draws and auctions, our Senior students will be manning their market stalls. There are a wide variety of goods on sale so don't forget to bring your spending money!

#### Ministry of Education Consultation: Draft Disability and Learning Support Action Plan

Consultation on the draft Disability and Learning Support Action Plan closes 31 October 2018. This is your opportunity to have a say on proposed actions to drive progress towards an inclusive education system, where the achievement, progress and participation of children and young people with additional learning needs, including disabilities, is valued and supported.

#### **Beyond National Standards - Reporting to Parents-**

Believe it or not, teachers are already making a start on end of year reporting information for parents and caregivers. As you will probably be aware, it is no longer compulsory for schools to report to parents against the National Standards. We will, however continue to report on reading, writing and maths progress against the New Zealand Curriculum levels (the National Standards were always based on these anyway).

The tools, tests and assessments that teachers use to assess learning are exactly the same as before.

Through a range standardised testing (tests that are the same in every school) and informal observations, we build a clear picture of what each child can do.

In addition to this, we also report against STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths), Health & PE and Te Reo Māori.

We also report on the National Key Competencies not covered by the core areas. These include Relating to Others, Managing Ourselves, Thinking and Participating and Contributing.

Reports will come home to you at the end of term.

Please feel free to make contact with your child's teacher if you have any questions prior to that. Open communication is the key to success and we are always aim to work together with you as a partnership.


